

DYNAMO MOSCOW – MOSCOW (UTC +3)



1923 - The year of foundation of the sports society Dynamo. The idea of creating a bandy club came to the members of the new sports society in the late autumn of 1923. Dynamo Moscow has won the championship 15 times in the Soviet Union and 7 times in the Russian Federation. The first title in 1936 and the last in 2013.

MOSCOW

Moscow is Russia's capital and largest city, located on the Moscow River in the central part of European Russia. After the revolution, the Russian capital was moved from Moscow to Saint Petersburg. During the Second World War, the Battle of Moscow stood here, during Operation Barbarossa. The city was attacked by nearly 1.5 million Germans and defended by Georgy Zhukov and about 1 250 000 men. The Soviet army defended the city and won.

Following the dissolution of the Soviet Union in 1991, Moscow remained the capital of the Russian Federation. Moscow is today a city torn between its ancient history and the modern development, as well as a world metropolis to count on both culturally and financially.

Population

About 12,2 million people live in Moscow, Europe's largest city.

Arena

Krylatskoye Sport Complex. The arena was ready September 9, 2004 and cost \$ 150 million to build. It has an audience capacity of 8 300 people at bandy games.

Dynamo Moscow advanced to the Russian final in the playoffs, but lost to Neftyanik 3-0 in games.
