

## YENISEI – KRASNOYARSK (UTC +7)



The club of Krasnoyarsk was founded in the autumn of 1934 at the initiative of Director Subbotin. Since then, the club has had a number of different names during the Soviet Union, including the name Zenit, among others. Since 1960, the club's name has been Yenisei. The club has won 15 Russian championships.

### KRASNOYARSK

Krasnoyarsk is an industrial city, the third largest city in Siberia and an important hub for the Trans-Siberian railway. The city is located on the Yenisei River, which also named the bandy team. The city was founded in July 1628 as a fort on the Russian border to the east. Krasnoyarsk is located 4140 kilometres east of Moscow.

Siberia is characterized by very cold winters and the lowest temperature measured in Krasnoyarsk is -56 degrees Celsius.

1 053 225 people live in Krasnoyarsk.
